
and this is another key focus in our School Improvement Plan, as we continue to strive to create greater awareness, understanding and appreciation of our community.

Pupils continue to benefit from their Daily Basic Skills Sessions (DBS) in these sessions pupils are taught phonics, using a synthetic phonics approach and then apply their phonics knowledge using high quality phonics books. "Pupils enjoyed a full calendar of events during our "It's a wonderful world" themed Arts week at the beginning of March. We danced, made music, painted, enjoyed art activities, tasted and smelled different foods and much more!





















Class 6 have enjoyed doing scientific experiments during their topic this term. They have been doing lots of different experiments testing states of matter and describing what is happening. To test how they could change a liquid into a solid, they made ice cream in a bag. They worked in groups to pour all the ingredients into a bag and then worked together to shake the bag, stopping to see what was happening to the ingredients. After lots of hard work shaking the bag the ice cream had become solid. The best part about this experiment was testing the results at the end. The pupils agreed it was yummy!
