### Read, Write Inc

In September we will be teaching phonics using the Read, Write Inc phonics scheme. This scheme is fully accredited by the DfE and is an engaging and exciting way to teach phonics, using pure phonic sounds. Pupils will be taught letter sounds which are matched to the RWI reading scheme, enabling early reading. For those pupils not ready to engage with learning letter sounds, we have written an 'Early Phonics Programme' which enhances and develops listening, rhyming, making sounds and vocalisation skills.

Reading books will be sent home with pupils so that you can support reading at home.

I was trained in the Story Massage programme during the last academic year. We have trialled it throughout the year with selected pupils, with excellent results. The programme is describe on the Story massage website as:-
