Review of Achievements & Areas of Improvement

Key achievements to date until July 2022:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
 The Ready to Learn provision for the school was enhanced through a greater range of resources available. Throughout the year, pupils attended a range of external sporting events with the opportunity to compete against each other and pupils from other schools. Staff engaged in a number of external training programmes to enhance their knowledge and skills. All pupils had opportunities to engage in a range of sports and activities in a way which was meaningful to them with appropriate support and adaptations in place where necessary. 	 On site fixed activities/resources for wheelchair users need to be enhanced. Further opportunities for pupils to engage in external sporting competitions needs to be developed. A wider variety of sports on available as part of the school PE offer to pupils. Development of the outdoor area to ensure that the forest area is fully accessible for pupils using wheelchairs and walking frames.
