- Fox Wood provides a carefully planned, personalised education pathway and exceptional outcomes for all pupils.
- We are very proud of this and feel that we have a responsibility to share our skills and expertise to benefit all pupils with special educational needs and their families in the wider community, not just our own pupils.

Rationale

- Outreach enables educators to work collaboratively to remove barriers to achievement by building capacity, sustainability and confidence across settings, thus creating a fully integrated and inclusive provision for pupils with SEN.
- The research evidence shows us that where outreach works best, the capacity building model is well understood and the outreach staff and receiving school staff work closely together with a clear focus on building staff expertise.
- Outreach is not intended to be a 'remedial' intervention, a stepping stone in the EHCP process or a pathway for admission to a special school.
- The prime aim is to support the work of the professionals who are already working with the child and the targets they have already set.

Our Outreach Team at Fox Wood are practising teachers and teaching assistants who are skilled and experienced within the field of SEN. They attend regular training to ensure that their knowledge and expertise is current.

Fox Wood offers advice and support to both the school / organisation as a whole, and/or to individual pupils.

School visits, advice and guidance, in-lesson support

A trained and experienced SEN teacher can visit your school setting and provide personalised advice and guidance to school staff. This could be for example, how to set up a visual timetable, how to differentiate activities, how to assess a pupil in a specific area. They can also provide in-lesson support for the pupil and school staff if required.



Observations, feedback and written reports

A trained and experienced SEN teacher can provide observations, feedback and written reports as required to support schools to address barriers to learning. The teacher can support the action planning process as a result of their recommendations.







Curriculum design and innovation, teaching and learning support






The Deputy Headteacher who has a Masters Degree in SEN teaching and learning can support curriculum design for individuals or whole groups of pupils. Drawing on her experience, she can support staff to bring the curriculum to life through structured teaching and learning strategies. We also offer curriculum based training such as Accreditation Options, Promoting Engagement through Music.






Support with communication e.g. Makaton, Intensive Interaction

As a communication and interaction specialist provision, we can provide skilled staff to work with you to develop personalised support packages for pupils, for example creating a Communication Passport, functional Makaton, Intensive Interaction and sharing record keeping ideas to enable schools to show progress over time. We also offer training sessions in Early Communication Skills.

 <p>AUTISM ACCREDITATION</p>	<p><u>Autism sensory needs, Autism awareness, Autism friendly environment</u></p> <p>Fox Wood is an NAS Advanced accredited school. A highly trained Autism lead teacher can visit your setting to provide individual advice or can deliver training on Autism awareness, Autism sensory needs, and/or promoting an Autism friendly environment. We offer a one day training course for Autism and Sensory Needs.</p>
 <p>www.Team-Teach.co.uk</p>	<p><u>Behaviour Support Programmes</u></p> <p>Fox Wood follows the Team Teach approach. We offer a one day 'Team Teach Foundation' course and a two day 'Team Teach Full' course. This can be at your school or here at Fox Wood dependent on your needs. Our Pupil Support Manager can support your staff to write a Behaviour Support Programme. We can also support you with policies, record keeping and associated documentation. Fox Wood also offer a full day training course on Challenging Behaviour and a full day training course on Team Teach AUTISM and Communication.</p>
	<p><u>Visual resources and structures</u></p> <p>Fox Wood can provide a range of visual resources and structures to meet individual needs. We can demonstrate a range of visual structures during an in-house visit to see them in practice. This could include providing a visual schedule for the school day or specific lesson structure to promote understanding of what is being delivered.</p>
	<p><u>Ready to Learn</u></p> <p>Fox Wood's ASD Lead teacher can offer specialist support and advice to schools for individual or groups of pupils to assist with setting up a Ready to Learn programme. This may take the form of developing individualised programmes, providing training to school staff and recommending practical strategies. Additional courses are also offered on sensory based strategies pertinent for classroom use.</p>

 	<p><u>Assessment Support</u></p> <p>An experienced teacher can support staff to develop assessment techniques for individual pupils who are working below age related expectations. This could be to support baseline assessments, development of Individual Education Programmes, use of Steps (previously P Levels) and/or moderation. We also offer a half day training course which gives an overview of SEN Assessment Strategies.</p>
	<p><u>Manual Handling</u></p> <p>Fox Wood have two Manual Handling Trainers who can deliver training either at your setting or here at Fox Wood. We can deliver a full day Manual Handling course or a half day refresher. We also offer ongoing telephone/email advice as required for our course attendees.</p>
	<p><u>Advice and support on all aspects of physical disability and curriculum access</u></p> <p>Fox Wood can offer personalised support packages for individual pupils with physical disabilities. This support will be tailored to meet your needs and could include reducing barriers to learning and use of equipment to increase curriculum access. Fox Wood also offer training on curriculum and assessment approaches for pupils with PMLD.</p>
	<p><u>Access to specialist resources – hydro pool, multi-sensory room</u></p> <p>Fox Wood have a range of highly specialised resources and rooms such as the hydrotherapy pool, multi-sensory room and sports hall which can all be hired out to schools. We also offer training sessions for NOP, EAP and use of the hydro pool hoist. Please contact us for further details.</p>

	<p><u>Specialist ICT equipment –loan, staff training, assessments</u></p> <p>Fox Wood have a range of specialist ICT equipment which can be loaned to schools to trial. We also provide staff training and individual assessments, for example for the use of eye gaze equipment, Prowise screens, and can support you to trial hi-tech communication software with individual pupils.</p>
	<p><u>Inreach</u></p> <p>Fox Wood can provide inreach for pupils for specific lessons or activities dependent on the needs of the individual. Fox Wood can also offer good practice visits for staff. Please contact us to discuss your specific requirements. We also offer training for Teaching Assistants to develop their knowledge of SEN Support in the Classroom Environment.</p>
	<p><u>Family outreach</u></p> <p>Fox Wood provides training that can be accessed by parents/carers and wider family members, for example in Early Communication Skills, AUTISM and Sensory Needs. These sessions are often hosted in the Woolston Learning Village café and delivered by trained and experienced school staff.</p>

Level 1 Outreach Package

Initial observational visit plus one further visit to provide advice and discussion as required

£250

Level 2 Outreach Package

Initial observation visit plus two further visits/inreach opportunities to provide advice, training, support to write programmes as required

Level 3 Outreach Package

Repeat visits to the school setting for ongoing pupil support, ongoing pupil inreach or wider school support with regard to curriculum, assessment

Team Teach – 1 Day Foundation Overview

Course overview:

Team Teach is the promotion of de-escalation strategies and the reduction of risk and restraint, to support teaching, learning and caring, by increasing staff confidence and competence, in responding to behaviours that challenge, whilst promoting and protecting positive relationships. The Positive Handling Strategies are suitable across all age and ability ranges. A look into personal safety, team building, non-verbal and verbal de-escalation communication strategies, some positive handling techniques- if required, together with documentation and legal guidance, listening and learning, recording, reporting and reviewing.

Team Teach – 1 Day Foundation –Autism Specific

Course overview:

Team Teach is the promotion of de-escalation strategies and the reduction of risk and restraint, to support teaching, learning and caring, by increasing staff confidence and competence, in responding to behaviours that challenge, whilst promoting and protecting positive relationships. Autism specific strategies will include early communication, meaningful communication, rewards systems, classroom management and organisation. Suitable across all age and ability ranges. A look into personal safety, team building, non-verbal and verbal de-escalation communication strategies, some positive handling techniques- if required, together with documentation and legal guidance, listening and learning, recording, reporting and reviewing. All of which will have a direct link and focus on the behaviours that a pupil with Autism, Autism traits would present.

The Positive Handling Strategies are suitable across all age and ability ranges. A look into personal safety, team building, non-verbal and verbal de-escalation communication strategies, some positive handling techniques together with documentation and legal guidance, listening and learning, recording, reporting and reviewing

Course overview:

To understand some of the barriers that both staff and pupils have within a classroom environment. Actively look at ways in which provision and pupil need can work effectively together to create positive outcomes. Develop classroom management and organisation skills to meet the needs of all learners. What does early communication look like including the use of intensive interaction? How communication with SEND pupils needs to be truly meaningful. How effective the use of rewards systems can be in promoting a positive working environment. How modifying the environment can assist in meeting the needs of learners. Differentiation of core work activities to provide a stimulating and accessible curriculum for all learners. Suitable across all age and ability ranges.

Early Communication skills

Course Aims/overview:

What does early communication look like including the use of Intensive Interaction? How communication with our pupils needs to be meaningful. What tools and equipment can we use to communicate with our pupils both low and high tech. Introduction to Picture Exchange Communication System (PECS) and how this can support communication. Introduction to Makaton signing to support making choices about likes, dislikes and interests. Suitable across all age and ability ranges. An overview of the fundamentals of communication and examples of how to respond positively. The impact Intensive Interaction can have on developing early communication skills. Experience a wide range of communication resources from low tech symbols, work systems, reward charts to higher tech iPads with communication apps e.g. proloquo2go. See and have a go at the latest technology in eye gaze.
