Message from Lucinda

Christmas can mean many things to many people, and I appreciate that for some of our pupils and families it can be a time of anxiety and increased demands. However, I hope that amongst all the hustle and bustle, the routine changes and the potential for sensory overload there will also be opportunities for you to enjoy time together, share some of the wonder and joy of the season, and reflect upon all of the things that you and your children have achieved over the past year.

As we look ahead to 2020 and another year full of new possibilities, hopes and achievements I would like to ask you to assist us by making a New Year's Resolution that will encourage your child to be more independent and will enable them to make the most of their school and learning experience. This is absolutely not a criticism of anyone but an acknowledgement that our children can be incredibly cute, and even better at getting their own way (and getting us to do their tasks for them!) So – for 2020's Home Learning Challenge - I ask you to:

Step 1 - Encourage your child to be a little bit more independent with some aspect of their life, this could be communicating with you and/or making choices using Eye Gaze/Switches/Makaton/Visuals/Voice, doing a new 'job' around the house, tidying up their toys/bedroom, sharing something with one of their siblings, assisting with or independently dressing or feeding themselves.

Step 2 - Share the new achievements that have resulted from Step 1 on Evidence for Learning (a reminder that we can help you if you are having trouble logging on – just please let us know!) Remember that every moment that makes you proud also means the world to us!

On behalf of myself, the Governors and staff of Fox Wood I would like to wish you all a very Peaceful and Happy Christmas. We look forward to continuing to work with you in 2020 to ensure that **Together We Shine** and to enable us to continue to fulfil our ambition of:

Encouraging independence and personal development through communication, engagement, laughter and learning.

The pupils all received a medal and certificate for their achievements as well as the runners-up trophy. Due to finishing in the top 2, the pupils will be receiving an invite to a regional event being held in Ellesmere Port to compete against schools from across the North West area.

Even more impressive than their achievement in the competition, the pupils were praised by all 3 event organisers for their outstanding behaviour and attitude on the day. There were even comments passed by other schools about how good our pupils had been. Everyone at Fox Wood are extremely proud of the Class 7 pupils for their achievement and fantastic representation of our school.

Class 9 held a mental health awareness day on Friday 13th December. We organised a mindfulness and wellbeing afternoon tea for all pupils, this included a variety of cakes, flavoured lip balms, smell jars and 'tea' playdough! Pupils engaged in a friendly chat with their peers and staff using a range of communication methods. The day was very successful and class 9 raised £36 for a local Warrington mental health charity called 'Time To Change'.









Santa Dash

Fox Wood School's Annual Santa Dash took place on 6th December, organised by Geta and staff. All the school set off at 9.30 in santa hats and festive jumpers. They walked 2 laps around Woolston Park whilst singing Christmas tunes and dancing. We raised an amazing £275 through pupil sponsorship which will go to school fund and will be used for Easter PE activities. 


Class 6 Sensory trip:
