Online Safety at Fox Wood

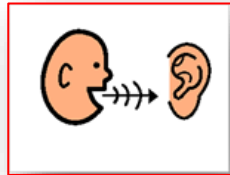
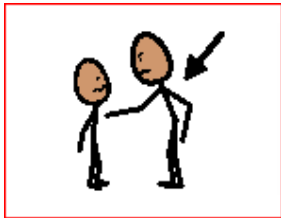

If someone is being unkind to you on the Internet?

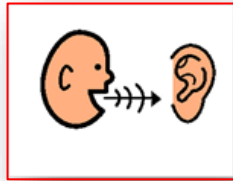
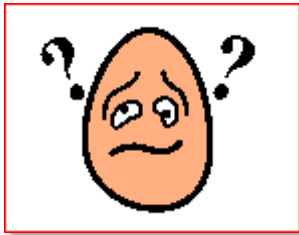
You must tell someone at school so we can help you.

Someone asking for your personal information, especially if you don't know them.

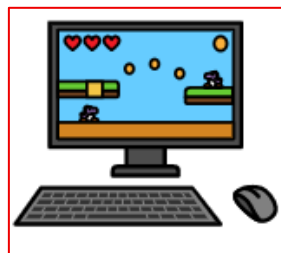
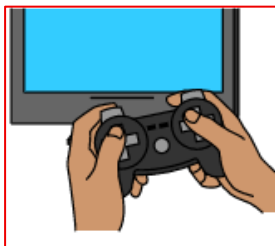
Has someone asked for your personal information (full name, birthday, address etc) on the Internet, when you don't know them in person?

- ❖ Your Midday Assistant

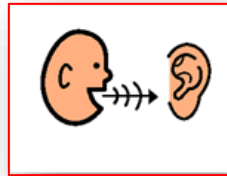
Online Gaming
